1) Meaning:

We use have got to talk about something we possess, we own.

Examples:

I have got a cat. → It's your cat.

She has got her book. → It's her book.

2) We also use have got to talk about family:

Examples:

I have got two sisters.

Peter has got one brother.

a. affirmative sentences:

Subject	have got	...
I/You He/She/It We/You/They	have got has got have got	a dog. three sisters. a nice house.

b. negative sentences :

Subject	have got + not	...
I/You He/She/It We/You/They	haven't got hasn't got haven't got	a dog. three sisters. a nice house.

c. in questions :
